Thanks to all our readers who visited Parliament on Australia Day 2013 to view selected original First Fleet indents. Over 2, 000 people visited Parliament House on the day. You can view the digital images of the First Fleet records and later records up to 1801 in Sentenced beyond the Seas. You can check over 12, 000 names in the Early Convict Index.

Convict indents are the lists of convicts transported to New South Wales on a particular ship. The early indents only provide name, date and place of trial and sentence. Later indents contain more information such as a physical description, native place, age and crime.






