

Liz Hicks, our librarian, came across a real find in the Intestate series - a 1878 Chinese Marriage certificate along with a translation. The beautiful document was located in the intestate estate case paper (NRS 13538) for Ah Lin (157/1903 10/27647) who died on 11 March 1903. The marriage certificate was forwarded to the Supreme Court by Ah Lin's wife Lam Lau Shi as evidence of their marriage. According to the file Ah Lin worked as


