






As many of you would know it can be difficult trying to locate details relating to an inquest or death for the time period 1825-1940, many of the files haven't survived. If you do run into this research 'brick wall' and the death occurred in Sydney then try the series Registers of bodies received (NRS

The Registers cover the time period 1908-1965. Each entry appears to be filled in by the person (usually a policeman) depositing the body and lists the entry number and date, name, sex, age, where born and occupation, when and where found, remarks giving full personal description (in cases which bodies have not been identified), and a statement of all wounds or injuries appearing thereon. Signed by the person depositing the body.





Miscellaneous property receipts are sometimes included with entries or at the back of the register. In addition an alphabetical index to bodies is located at the beginning of each register. To check what dates are covered in each register see the item Another related series is NRS 1789 Post Mortem Registers [Sydney Coroner] 1908-56. Under each entry, the registers give information under the following headings: date of death, date of autopsy, name of doctor making autopsy, name of medical attendant of deceased if known, name of deceased, birthplace, age and occupation, previous history and habits of deceased, circumstances connected with the death of deceased, special remarks, external description, result of post mortem (cranium, thorax, abdomen), cause of death, signature of doctor making the examination, and date. From about 1904 a different form was used showing information under the following headings: result of examination, name, age, occupation,


